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POST-MCO UPDATES

As MCO is being gradually relaxed and we started to welcome staff and students back to the university, the university community engagement office has drafted the 'IMU Community Engagement Guidelines for the New Normal' in line with the recent launch of the "Embracing the New Norms" campaign by the Prime Minister of Malaysia. The guidelines aim to providing guidance and opportunities for staff and students to continue bridging the gap with the community on various platforms such as:

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COLLABORATIONS

IMU signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Malaysian Institute of Road Safety Research (MIROS), InCiSion Malaysia and DriveMark to formalise a collective effort to promote a Nationwide Road Safety Campaign.

The collaboration aims to

- Encourage and reward safe driving behaviours through a National Safest Driver Challenge (NSDC)
- Educate drivers on road traffic accidents and promote safe driving behaviours through awareness campaigns
- Research on driving behaviour data to develop policies that can reduce road traffic accidents through behavioural change

We are glad to be a part of this initiative as it's in line with one of IMU Community Engagement's anchoring pillars based on the UN Sustainable Development Goal Target 3.6 that aims to halve the number of global deaths and injuries from road traffic accidents by 2020

National Safest Driver Challenge (NSDC)

- Part of the Nationwide Road Safety Campaign aims to reduce road accidents through better understanding of drivers' behaviours with the help of DriveMark.
- DriveMark is an app that scores driving behaviours by tracking some of the most common driving patterns including braking, acceleration, speeding and cornering. It also incentivises safe drivers with rewards such as fuel vouchers, insurance cashbacks and prizes.
